

**PERRYOPOLIS BOROUGH COUNCIL**  
**MONTHLY MEETING**  
**JANUARY 14, 2026**

A monthly meeting of the Perryopolis Borough Council was called to order by Council President Bill Compliment at 7 p.m. on Wednesday January 14, 2026, in Council Chambers at the Perryopolis Borough Building.

Present were Mayor Charles Petrosky, Council President Bill Compliment, Vice President Wayne Nicholls, Niel Costabile, Jacob Shoaf, Danielle Costabile, Frank Masney, Mark Plewniak, Solicitor Melinda Dellarose, and Colleen Pontoriero, secretary.

Also present were Mark Pasquale, Barry Shoaf, Lori Jacobs, Matt Hint (Joseph B. Fay Company) and Tom Kmetz.

A Motion to accept the minutes from December 17th Council Meeting was made by Wayne Nicholls, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Jacob Shoaf—All Yes—Motion Carried.

A Motion to accept the minutes from the January 5<sup>th</sup> Reorganization Meeting was made by Mark Plewniak, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Wayne Nicholls—All Yes—Motion Carried.

Devin White informed Council that there was going to be a public meeting for Parks and Recreations Master plan on January 28 at 6:30.

A letter was received from Brad Baker asking to be reappointed to another 5-year term on the Perryopolis Joint Authority Board.

A Motion to reappoint Brad Baker to another 5-year term on the Perryopolis Joint Authority Board was made by Wayne Nicholls, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Mark Plewniak—All Yes—Motion Carries.

A letter was received from Charles Deardoff asking to be reappointed to another 5-year term on the Perryopolis Joint Authority Board.

A Motion to reappoint Charles Deardodd to another 5-year term on the Perryopolis Joint Authority Board was made by Frank Masney, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Mark Plewniak—All Yes—Motion Carried.

A letter was received from Lisa Buchina asking to be reappointed to another 5-year term on the Perryopolis Parks and Recreation Authority Board.

A Motion to reappoint Lisa Buchina to another 5-year term on the Perryopolis Parks and Recreation Authority Board was made by Danielle Costabile, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Jacob Shoaf—All Yes—Motion Carried.

A discussion was held about bonding the Borough Streets during the construction of Layton Bridge. Traffic for the bridge cannot go through the Circle until spring when matting can be placed over the bricks. Traffic will use Borough Roads until then.

A Motion to approve an Excessive Maintenance Agreement with Fay Construction to be drafted by Melinda Dellarose and sent to Fay Construction was made by Wayne Nicholls, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Mark Plewniak—Frank Masney Abstained—All others yes—Motion Carried.

A quote for \$ 1,191.12 was received from Ford Office Technologies for a desk top computer for the police office.

Bill Compliment said that he compared this quote with other companies and it was comparable.

A Motion to order the desk top computer from Ford Office Technologies was made by Niel Costabile, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Jacob Shoaf—All Yes—Motion Carried.

Jacob Shoaf presented 3 quotes for a new AED for the Borough Building. The quotes were as follows: \$1,523.00, \$2,307.00, and \$2157.00. He recommended Cardiac Science Powerheart G5 for \$2,157.00.

A Motion to purchase the Cardiac Science Powerheart G5 for \$ 2,157.00 was made by Wayne Nicholls, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Danielle Costabile—All Yes—Motion Carried.

A discussion about new AEDs for the Police was held.

A Motion to pay the bills due and payable plus \$50.00 for Paw N Claws was made by Danielle Costabile, 2<sup>dn</sup> by Jacob—All Yes—Motion Carried.

Danielle Costabile commented that she thought Wayne Nicholls being on the Street Committee was a conflict of interest since Adam Nichols is his son.

Melinda Dellarose said at this time she didn't have an answer for that.

Bill Compliment said he added a new committee, New Business Development hoping to attract new businesses to Perryopolis Borough.

A discussion was held about belonging to the Fayette County Chamber of Commerce. more information will be gathered on the chamber membership.

Bill Compliment thanked council for the sympathy arrangement for his father-in-law.

Dennis Heath thanked council for the sympathy arrangement for his father.

A discussion was held about holding council work sessions on the first Wednesday of the month at 6 p.m. when needed. Everyone agreed.

Mayor Petrosky gave the state of the borough report. He said he looks forward to working with council. He read the police report for December.

A discussion was held about Gary Farrell being added to the police schedule once he has completed the Act 57 requirements.
